

DIRECTIONS FOR THE SAFE USE OF BLEACH:

- Always clean areas with a non-ammonia soap or detergent before disinfecting the area with a bleach solution!
- Never mix bleach with ammonia because it creates a harmful gas that can make you ill!
- Never mix bleach with other cleaning supplies because it may make you ill.
- Always use bleach with care in a well-ventilated area.
- Wear protective gloves and goggles to prevent skin and eye damage from bleach.

INSTRUCTIONS ON MIXING BLEACH SOLUTIONS:

- To disinfect floors use a solution of $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of bleach in one gallon of water.
- If mold has already begun to grow on floors, use a solution of 1.5 cups of bleach in a gallon of water. This also equals $\frac{1}{2}$ gallon of bleach per 5 gallons of water. Apply with a clean spray bottle or garden sprayer and allow the area to dry.
- When water is contaminated, add one Tablespoon of bleach to each gallon of water before washing your hands with it.
- Chlorine bleach is no longer effective when the chlorine smell disappears. Remember to mix new batches of bleach solution frequently for proper disinfection.
